News From Early Church

Well the planning is over and Early Church moves to its weekly format from the start of December. As we have decided to follow the Common Lectionary, rather than picking our own themes and stories, December will see us following the advent story using primarily Luke's gospel. January will then see us follow on with Luke's story as Jesus grows up and starts His ministry.



We hope there will be the same informal, family friendly atmosphere - the same fun - but we also hope to inject more learning. And we will be listening - what is working well, what is working less well and what needs changing. In the middle of January the Early Church team will be meeting to review and reflect. Your feedback will be important to that process.

Going weekly has produced a number of challenges, not least with the physical space. We need to accommodate the rest of the Trinity family while giving the Early Church congregation the time and space required. Some may say we have come up with a radical even a surprising solution. From the start of December Early Church will relocate from the Sanctuary to the Hall. This relocation will solve the issues of the two services, Early Church and the 10:30, running into each other. The Hall is a more flexible space and we will be able to set up a crèche area and an area for slightly older children. With Early Church's Coffee& still taking place in the Chatteris suite, Early Church will be well clear of the Hall in time for 10:30's tea and coffee. We will need to work at making the Hall an inviting and worship filled spaced but we think it can be achieved to the benefit of all who use the Hall.

We have had to make other difficult decisions. Running a standard Early Church service four to five times a month was going to create problems with producing a band every week and sufficient leaders to enable the break-outs to happen. The solution – the third Sunday of every month will be an all age breakfast service with the fifth Sundays being an all age "agape" style service. We hope that both these services will be attractive to the wider Trinity family and will help to produce a bridge between the two main services.

Please pray for Early Church as we enter the new phase. God has blessed us greatly so far. This is a big step. Pray that we are walking with God; that our plans are pleasing and acceptable to Him and that Early Church will continue to further God's kingdom here on Earth, here in Leighton Buzzard.

The man said go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way.

Trinity Methodist Church Council—Minutes Summary

- 23 present, 5 apologies.
- Rev. Seung-Wook Jung opened the meeting with devotions based in 1 Kings 4:29-34 looking at Solomon's wisdom and how nothing is beyond God's wisdom, concern & interest.
- Minutes of the previous meeting agreed and signed with necessary amendments.
- Joan Gregory has retired as Secretary of MHA from the New Year, Chris Bosworth has agreed to replace her.
- Early Church Please see Graham Seaton's article on pages
 4-5 for changes. It was agreed that Early Communion would
 take place on 3rd Sundays and join Early Church for breakfast
 at a Café style service and Holy Communion at 10.30am
 service would be on 2nd Sundays. Recognition that there would
 be need to update sound and projection in the hall, but this
 would benefit many users.
- Property Committee the Annual Methodist Church Checklist was approved. The gutters (which caused the flooding) will be cleared 4 times a year rather than annually.
- Neighbourhood, Mission and Family Committee This committee is under review to assess its uses and if it needs to (re)define its aims.
- Finances/Resources Church Council agreed the report which included the success of recovering the shortfall in the General Fund.
- Tony Oldroyd has agreed to be a Sunday Steward, but we still need to encourage others to join both stewards and Leadership Team.

- Legacies A group is now in place to address the use of the legacies. It was felt that the money should be used to further Trinity's vision. Two projects have been identified: a) installing a new audio-visual system across the whole church b) redeveloping the premises to make them more suitable for purpose.
- Leadership Team GDPR forms are now being circulated and these should be handed back to a steward by 30th November for inclusion in the 2019 directory. Christmas greetings will not appear in Trumpeter this year, but in a separate card.
- Seung-Wook Jung will be taking a sabbatical June-September 2019.
